



Abraham Gorin

Abraham Gorin, 93 of Buenos Aires, Argentina, passed away on Thursday, June 3rd at Evergreen Commons Nursing and Rehabilitation Center after suffering a severe stroke and convalescing for a couple of weeks.

Abe was a leather cutter, a trade that he learned from his father and that he practiced with him and his brothers Zrulick and Jacobo in Argentina. He served in the Argentine military riding in the cavalry regiment, was a journalist based in New York City for Revista Gente (Argentina), and continued his leather cutter trade working in Manhattan for several years. After moving back to Argentina for some years, Abraham then relocated to South Florida in 1993 where he worked as a liquor store manager for Walgreens, something he very much enjoyed. Throughout his life, Abe was an avid photographer, capturing with his Leika and Hasselblad cameras beautiful pictures of his wife and children. And at one point he owned a Ford Model A which he enjoyed driving as a chauffeur for special occasions and to vacation spots with his family in Argentina.

Abe was the son of Jewish immigrants Hersh Gorin, from Ukraine, and Juana Rotman, from Poland. His parents moved to Argentina in the mid 1920's to seek a better future. He is survived by his wife of 47 years Teresa Gorin (nee

Larumbe) of Rosario, Argentina, his two sons Pablo Gorin and Gustavo Gorin, and Jasmine, his dog. His most famous words were “don’t be nervous pibe (a term of endearment in Argentina meaning ‘kid’)” to his son Pablo before he had to play a concert.
