December 6, 1939 - July 31, 2022

Charles E. Moore, III (Charlie) passed away at his home in Cohoes, New York on July 31, 2022 at the age of 82.

Charlie began receiving services for his disabilities from the State of New York at the age of four, from 1943 - 1975. He spent time at various state-run facilities across the state, but with increased awareness of the system he was able to move into a community residence run by the Center for Disabilities Services (formerly ROI, Inc.) on Ontario Street. When the Mohawk Street residence opened, he was one of the first residents to move in on January 16, 1979.

Charlie was a friendly and personable man. Despite the challenges he endured, Charlie was always able to find humor in any situation, and it showed through his loveable giggle. He loved to sit in the foyer so he could be in the middle of everything going on at the house. Charlie was an avid bird-watcher, animal lover, gardener, and loved to decorate the house with flowers. He planted herbs and vegetables in his custom-made garden bed. He loved to decorate for the holidays, make arts and crafts, watch old TV westerns, and listen to music. His foot tapping to the beat was the heartbeat of the home.

Over the last 43 years at Mohawk Street, Charlie had the opportunity to work with countless staff. His huge heart, twinkly blue eyes, and contagious smile

made a lasting impression with anyone that spent time with him. Charlie established everlasting connections with the staff he worked with, and was always happy to check in with what they were doing and how their families were. He frequently asked to see pictures of their relatives and pets, and asked about them by name.

Charlie's passing leaves a gigantic hole in the home, and he will be missed immeasurably. He was predeceased by parents, Charles E. Moore, Jr, Anita Moore, and his sister, Janice Sleasman. He is survived by four nieces and nephews, and six great-nieces and great-nephews. His family would like to thank all the current and previous staff of Mohawk Street for the loving care provided to Charlie over the years.
