A historian and nature conservationist at heart, Everett believed we should always learn about important topics and also care for the natural world. He studied the origins of Christianity and created an organization that shared bibles and religious items, free of charge, to everyone he encountered.

Dad is survived by his children Nicole Green of Waterford and Michael (Missy) Green of Winston-Salem, NC, sister Kathleen Clothier of Corinth, as well as

several grandchildren and great-grandchildren.
