Francis J. Bellerose 87, died April 29, 2015. Born in Cohoes and a life long resident he was son of the late George and Roseanne Malo Bellerose. He was an active member of the former St. Joseph's Church in Cohoes and began working at the church in 1938, he also sang in the church choir beginning in 1958, he was a member of the church Activity Society and served as church historian.
