Due to the Covid-19 restrictions funeral services will be private. There are no calling hours. Interment will be in Albany Rural Cemetery.

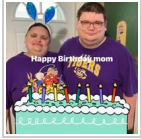

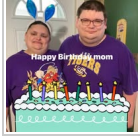

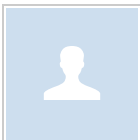
